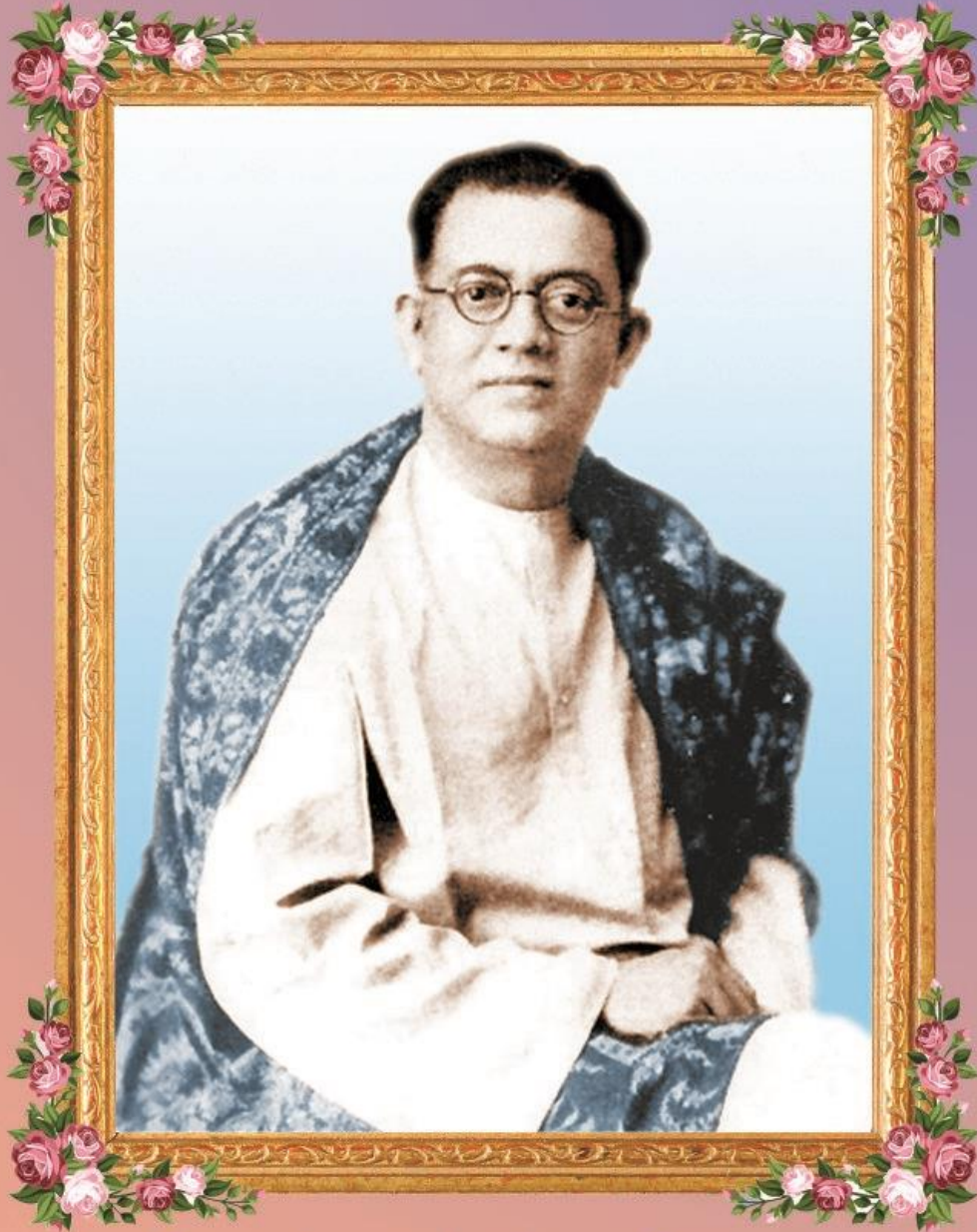

At the outset, we would like to say that after many hurdles, Maharaja Srischandra College was accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2016. We seek to keep pace with the modern world and aim at reaching the milestones that we had promised ourselves during the first cycle of accreditation.

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The college was set up by Maharaja Srischandra Nandi in memory of his father Maharaja Manindrachandra Nandi who was a renowned philanthropic Zamindar of Cossimbazar. Maharaja Srischandra Nandi was an equally illustrious personality in the socio-cultural history of early 20th century Bengal. He represented the Bengal zamindars in the Fazle Haq-Shyamaprasad ministry. Some local workers and academicians of the locality in which the college is now located encouraged Srischandra Nandi to set up a college that would cater to a huge section of students residing in this locality. The Maharaja accepted their proposal and the college was set up in 1941.



LOCATION OF THE COLLEGE

An old dilapidated building, which previously functioned as a charitable dispensary, was converted to a college. The building, is now the common property of three separate colleges: Maharani Kasiswari, Maharaja Manindrachandra and Maharaja Srischandra. Maharaja Srischandra College as a separate institution emerged in 1964. The concept of evening college in Bengal emerged after the Partition, especially when an exodus of Bengali Hindus from erstwhile East Bengal to West Bengal took place. A large number of refugees settled in and around Kolkata. They had to earn their daily bread and at the same time pursue their education. Against this socio-economic background, establishment of evening colleges became a necessity. In recent years there has been a widening of the scope of our service since hundreds of general students, both male and female, are taking admission into the college. However, we still intend to provide scope of education to in-service people, and many in small business or in unorganized sectors. Situated at 20, Ramkanto Bose Street, Kolkata-3 and very close to Shyambazar five-point crossing, the college enjoys a constant flow of students from different parts of the city of Kolkata. The proximity of the college to Shyambazar Metro Station, Howrah, Sealdah and Dum Dum Railway Stations, as also to the Bagbazar Ferry Ghat enables students to commute from the suburban areas of North 24 Parganas and Hooghly district. Apart from students coming from distant places, the college over the years has established a close affinity with its surrounding locality by catering to the interest of innumerable students of this area. Although the sharing of a common building with two other colleges becomes inconvenient at certain points, we are proud to make the maximum utilization of all our resources for the benefit of society. All decisions regarding the maintenance of the college premises is undertaken by the Co-ordination Committee formed as per C.U. Statute.

SECOND CAMPUS

A second campus of the college is in the pipeline in a new building donated by Smt. Bandita Mukherjee, the daughter of our Ex-principal, Late Biswanath Mukherjee at 12 Padmanath Lane, Kolkata - 4.

COLLEGE HOURS

The College Office remains open from 2.30 p.m. to 9.00 p.m. on week days and from 5.00 p.m. to 8.30 p.m. on Saturdays. Classes are held between 3.30 p.m. and 9.00 p.m. on all working days of the week and between 4.15 p.m. and 9 p.m. on Saturday. The Library and Common Rooms remain open during the office hours of the College.

VISITING HOURS FOR STUDENTS AND GUARDIANS

The time for the students and guardians to meet the Principal is 6.30-7.30 p.m. on all days except Saturdays.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance in 75% of the total number of lectures delivered in each subject is compulsory for students of degree classes failing which they may not be promoted or sent up for C.U. Examination. Regarding attendance, C.U. norms are to be followed.



ACADEMIC SESSION

The Academic Session of the College commences from July and ends in June every year. The first year classes commence within one month from the publication of the H.S. results. The second year & third year classes commence as per University norm within one week of the completion of theoretical examinations. Students have to take provisional admission.



TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The college encourages every teacher to make a detailed lesson plan to ensure effective class teaching and proper management of time. Every year, before the commencement of classes, each department arranges meeting to earmark portions of the syllabus for every teacher.

The syllabi are unitized on the basis of :

- (a) recommended lectures per topic.
- (b) number of teaching days available per year.

The syllabus is normally followed as stated in the teaching plan. If there are any modifications, the changes are communicated to the students and the schedule is accordingly changed.

A detailed lesson plan is submitted by each teacher to the Principal and academic calendar for each department is published. The academic calendar contains detailed account of the syllabus to be covered in each term and for specific examinations. The periodic/yearly progress of the syllabus and problems related to it are discussed in the departmental meetings held throughout the academic year. The academic calendar of all departments are uploaded in the college website.

LIBRARY

The College prides itself on having a wellstocked and spacious library. With its books arranged as 'text books', 'reference materials', 'journals', 'periodicals', 'magazines' of both general and special interest, the library benefits the students and the teachers. It has a spacious reading room and a well-organized lending system.



1. Library cards (one reference and two home-lending) are issued to every student against his/her Acknowledgement Card at the beginning of the session. The card is valid for one academic year.
2. The library cataloguing is fully computerized using SOUL software. This online cataloguing is accessible to both teachers and students.
3. The library offers Reading Room facility to teachers and students.
4. The library also offers reference services.
5. E-resource can be accessed through n-list infibnet consortium.



LIBRARY RULES

1. Students willing to take one more book for home issue over and above the usual number are asked to pay Rs. 100/- or the book value (whichever is higher) as caution money.
2. For physical verification of the library stock, students and teachers are asked to return all the books before the summer recess. Students must return their library cards and obtain a clearance certificate before appearing for a university examination or before seeking T.C.
3. The loss of the library card has to be immediately reported to the librarian. Fine for loss of a card is Rs. 10/-

SEMINAR LIBRARY

As enrichment device, Seminar Libraries have been opened by various departments such as English, Bengali, Hindi, History, Economics and Political Science. Along with the seminar libraries the Central Library of the College serves both the teachers and the students. The idea behind introducing the Seminar library facility is to enable the teacher to guide the students about reference materials in a cozy, informal atmosphere. Very often the seminar library period is used for students' counselling.

QUESTION BANK

Question Banks of various subjects prepared by the teachers of the college are stored in the library for the assistance of the students.

STUDENTS' SEMINARS

To infuse in the students aspir it of deeper enquiry on the subjects included in their curricula, we have started organizing departmental seminars on a relatively larger scale where chair persons from other institutions are invited. Their valuable comments on the papers encourage the students, boost their self-confidence, and most importantly enable them to locate their lacunae. Various departments organized students' seminar in the 2016-2017 session and certificates were given to 'participating students'. 14 September, 2017 a student seminar was held by Dept. of Hindi.



COMPUTER LABORATORY

The College provides special training classes for Information Technology in its Computer Lab

MODERN TEACHING AIDS

College provides audiovisual aids like OHP & LCD projector etc. in the class rooms for easy and better explanation of the subject matter.

PHONE FACILITY

Two phone sets are installed in the college – one in the main building corridor, another in the Students' Canteen – for providing local call facility to students. Moreover, free of cost telephone facilities have been provided in the Students' Union Room, Office and Teachers' Room.

INTERNET FACILITY

Free of cost Broad Band Internet Facility is provided to teachers, non-teaching staff and students of the college.

SEMINARS, LECTURES & WORKSHOP

The College organizes UGC sponsored National and State level seminars. Various Seminars on science, sports, women's empowerment, postmodernism and philosophy have attracted an impressive audience and appreciation.

On 12th April, 2014 a UGC-sponsored Seminar on "Rethinking Multiculturalism : Some Reflections" was organized by the Humanities departments of the College.



A workshop on the incorporation of New Company's Act, 2013 in the B.Com syllabi was held on 13.04.2014. A Seminar on 'Goods & Service Tax' was organised by Alumni Association in 2015 where the main speaker was Sri Mrityunjay Acharjee, Vice president, Balmer Lawrie.

In January 2016, "Rediscovering The Ganga : Issues of Pollution Management" was organized by the Geography Department and the main speaker was Mr. Kalyan Rudra.

Another seminar on "Increasing Incidents of PCOS" with Dr. Tulika Jha was organised.

"Diabetes the Silent Killer" was organized by the NSS Unit and the Main speaker was Dr. S. Roy Chaudhuri.

The Hindi Department organized a seminar in April 2017 "Dalit Sahitya Ki Awadharana Aur B. R. Ambedkar" and the speaker was Prof. Vijay Kumar Bharti. Prof. Siddhartha Majumdar spoke on "Effects of Demonitization" in another seminar organized by the Department of Commerce.

- The college organized a seminar on "Food Habits and Cancer Prevention" on 11 August, 2017. The talk was delivered by Dr. Sankar Kumar Nath.
- Department of Commerce organized a State-Level Seminar on "Mutual Fund in India" on 4 September, 2017.
- The Bengali Department of the college organized an International Seminar on "Satobarse Narayan Gangopadhyay : Jibon O Sahitya" on 10 March, 2018, which was inaugurated by Dr. Sahid Iqbal from Rajshahi University of Bangladesh and Dr. Manas Majumdar, former professor of University of Calcutta.

**SPOKEN ENGLISH**

A short term course in Spoken English has been introduced for the students of the college from the academic session 2015-16. There is a nominal fee for the course. Interested students may contact Prof. Sunanda Ray or Prof. Debjani Lahiri of English Department.

REMEDIAL CLASSES

According to the free time available to every teacher a schedule for remedial / counselling classes are set. The students are encouraged to appear for mock tests before the university examinations to prepare themselves for the final exams. Since the inclination of individual students for evaluation of his/her standard matters greatly, such mock tests cannot be taken on a mass scale. Nevertheless, remedial lectures, counselling and evaluation continue on one to one basis, and this is not time bound.

EVALUATION OF THE STUDENTS

Evaluation of the students gets special attention. Apart from class tests, there is an informal, continuous process of internal assessment that enables the teacher to identify the strength and weakness of individual students. The results are distributed to the students in a parentteacher meeting to communicate to the guardians the specific problems of their wards.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Any change of address and telephone number during the period of study in the college must be instantly brought to the notice of the Principal.

DISCIPLINE

Maintenance of discipline in the college premises is strictly enforced. The following are strictly prohibited :

- Talking or creating disturbances inside or outside the class.
- Loitering in the corridors or outside the college premises.
- Impersonation during roll-call.
- Damaging college property.
- Resorting to unfair means during examinations.
- Smoking in the college premises.
- Use of mobile phones in the class rooms and examination halls.

CAREER COUNSELLING

The college arranges career counselling of students after the Part - II/Part - III examination to provide necessary knowhow and guide them in choosing right career options. Various organizations are approached to take sessions on career counselling. Apart from this “Entry in Service” “Computer Accounting” and “Spoken English” courses are introduced which will facilitate the students in building their career.



2021 P R O S P E C T U S PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell of Maharaja Srischandra College, Kolkata creates a platform where students can showcase their talents which different companies seek to explore and utilise. Starting from 2018, we have successfully placed a section of graduates who have appeared for placements. Initially the companies are invited to take part in the recruitment drive. Those interested respond and thus register with us for the year for recruitment. The students are intimated and a vast number register for the interview.



The interview process usually starts with a Power Point Presentation where the company enlightens the students about their company profile. Those interested then go for the interview, which usually comprises of a written test followed by group discussion and personal interview. The job scenario today is facing the onslaught of ground breaking competition from all fields; and employment into good companies and organizations has become a daunting task. So, for the benefit of its students preparing to face the job market, the Maharaja Srischandra College Placement Cell has risen to the occasion and has successfully aided in providing opportunities and employment to its outgoing students.

A great number of new as well as regular companies visited our college for Placement throughout the year. It started off in August with Futures First being the first, followed by companies such as Titan, Amazon, Zomato, ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank, Big Bazaar, Central Mall, Capitoria Advisory Services, Mindshaft Media Pvt. Ltd., Mansa BPO Services Pvt Ltd. etc. We have placed a number of students through on campus drives and off campus interviews from departments like B.Com (Hons.), Economics (Hons.) , Bengali (Hons.), English (Hons.), Hindi (Hons.), History (Hons.), Political Science (Hons.) and B.A., B.sc. and B.Com General Students. We have students working at companies on various internship offers as well for second and thirds year students. There is a great deal of enthusiasm among final year students when the placement season starts off. Students come forward with their queries regarding companies, placement procedures and the Placement Cell members readily help them.

FOR STUDENTS

The Placement Cell of Maharaja Srischandra College acts as an integral link between the students and corporate organisations. Maharaja Srischandra College is one of the few colleges to start a Placement Cell and has facilitated placements for many students. The placement cell functions under the supervision of Dr. Avijit Chakrabarti and Prof. Ayan Chatterjee and operates all around the year to arrange campus interviews by the companies. The Cell acts as a contact point for all companies that wish to select students from Maharaja Srischandra College. It facilitates the whole process from collecting the CVs of the students to organising Pre-placement talks by companies to the final induction process.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The college has constituted a Grievance Redressal Cell to look into the specific grievances of the students. There is also a box in which the students can drop in their complaints and suggestions. There is also an E-mail address, where the students can register their grievances.

EVALUATION BY STUDENTS

The college has introduced a system to evaluate the teachers and the college as a whole by asking the students to fill up a questionnaire which is kept confidential. We hope that this will enable the college to locate its lacunae and improve its academic ambience.

EXAMINATIONS

Class tests are held regularly, as per C.U. rules. Each department aims at two tutorial classes per Honours Paper per week and one seminar per subject every month.

PARENT-TEACHER MEETINGS

The college conducts Parent-Teacher Meetings during every academic session which enable parents to interact with the teachers and discuss various academic issues and problems of their wards. Parents are also informed about the latest development in the college which includes information about various career-oriented courses launched by the college in different academic sessions. Frank and face-to-face interactions of this kind between parents and teachers go a long way in the all-round development of the students' career.

GAMES AND SPORTS

The College has no playground to promote outdoor games. Two neighbouring playgrounds - Shyam Park and Gourimat Udyan are used for practicing outdoor games. Nevertheless, the College provides facilities for indoor games and encourages its students to participate in Annual sports, and several state-level competitions. The college ensures participation of students in Inter-Collegiate Tournaments / Championships, in Inter-University and other tournaments and championships, and long-term coaching camps.

The students of the college have participated in the following university/state-level competitions:

The college cricket team won the inter-college cricket championship trophy organised by Serampore College in 2007. The cricket team also performed extremely well in the cricket tournaments organised by CAB and Calcutta University.

In 2011, our college cricket team succeeded in inter-college cricket tournament organised by the University of Calcutta. The team participated in the Semi-Final and the boys came off with flying colours. In recent times most of the Cricket Players represented their club in the 1st division / 2nd division cricket league organised by CAB. Our Football team reached the semifinals of North Calcutta District Sports Championship organised by Govt. of West Bengal. Prof. Sujatra Bhattacharyya, Prof-in-charge of sports and games, ably mobilized and motivated the team.

Every year the annual Sports of the College is held in winter season with the active participation of students, teachers and non-teaching members.



The NCC unit of Maharaja Srischandra College is functioning as Company - 4, 19 Bengal Battalion, under an expert guidance of Prof. Prem Bahadur Manjhi. Professor Manjhi was sent to attend the pre-commission training and qualified with grade 'A'. He was then commissioned as Lieutenant. Professor Manjhi has also performed his duty in the 14 CA TC (Combined Annual Training Camp) as a camp adjutant.

NSS

The NSS unit of the college actively participates in various social welfare programmes. Regular activities include book distribution in slum areas, plantation of saplings in the neighbourhood, cleaning of College premises and organising health awareness campaigns and Health Camps. Three Health Camps were organised in Kalindi and Kestopur. The NSS unit organized a seminar on "Challenges of Mountaineering : Scaling the Heights" on 9th August, 2017.

A Special Camp with special emphasis on "child labour" was held in 2011. A seminar on the condition of child labour in India was organised in the college premises where various distinguished speakers and guests were present. In 2012 & 2013 special camps were organised on Environmental Degradation and Implications of Service, respectively.



In 2013 - 2014, the NSS unit organized AIDS awareness programme in collaboration with a clinic, regular health camps involving slum children, old people & women, Special camp (i) Survey work by the volunteers on present job opportunities (ii) Seminar on future of higher education in the context of employment generation. In 2014-15, the NSS unit of the college organized various health camps and awareness programmes as part of their regular activity.

The unit also organized a 7-day special camp comprising the issue of traffic awareness and rules. The volunteers conducted extensive survey work and a seminar on this was organized. Dr. Shashi Panja, Minister, Department of Women and Child Welfare, Govt. of West Bengal, Prof. Ashis Sana, Programme Officer C.U. and Calcutta Police Officials, were among the eminent speakers. In 2015 - 2016, the NSS unit organised seminar on Health awareness, specially for women. In their special camping activities the NSS unit conducted various welfare programmes in an orphanage at New Town. In 2016-2017 the NSS unit continued with their programmes of planting saplings, social awareness programmes and other activities. The unit arranged Neighbourhood Youth Parliament Programme under National Young Leaders Programme, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India in association with Nehru Yuva Kendra Kolkata (NYKK) on 26th March, 2018. The unit also organized an awareness programme/rally for the prevention of vector borne diseases on 6th April, 2018. The unit is also engaged in the campaign against vector borne diseases and different activities in collaboration with the Ramakrishna Mission, Baranagar.

CHEAP STORE & CANTEEN

The college has two separate canteens for the teachers and student subsidized by the college. Students can xerox and buy books from the cheap store of the college.



COMMON ROOMS

There are separate common rooms for boys and girls. Facilities for indoor games are available in the common rooms.



HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

Hostel accommodation is available for the female students of the college at Maharani Kasiswari College Students' Hostel which is adjacent to the college.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

1. The students of the college organise blood donation camps in the college premises at regular intervals where students and several teachers and Non-Teaching Staff donate blood.
2. The students and teachers of the college collected a substantial amount of money and old clothes for donation to the Calcutta Orphanage. The college also donated a few almirahs to the orphanage.
3. Almirahs and books were also donated by the college to Gaurab Majumdar Shantimony Ghosh Smriti Pathagar, a local library for needy students.

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4. The college organised a 'Briksha Rop an' or tree planting programme. Many student s participated in this programme and planted saplings in the neighbourhood.
5. The NCC cadets of the college participated in the pulse polio programme organised by the health department of the government of West Bengal.
6. The NSS unit also performs various extensions activities.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

The College encourages cultural activities among student s under the auspices of the S tudent s' Union. Cultural programmes to mark import ant National Event s and memorable dates in the College Calendar form a p art of the College life. Competitions in Music, Recit ation, Debate etc. are organised every year and prizes are given to successful competitors. In 2015-2016, the college p articipated in youth parliament programme and won the second prize in the quiz competition. Educational excursions are also organised.

- | Every year the Students' Union of the College organizes Freshers' Welcome and Annual Cultural Fuunction. Such programmes not only lead to the free intermingling of the existing and the fresh batches, but also provide the student a platform for displaying their talents.
- | A picnic of the Students' Union is organized every year.
- | The Students' Union also organizes Saraswati Puja. They arrange an Art Exhibition on the same day with the paintings and sketches of our students.
- | Every year student s of Bengali dep artment organise Rabindra Jayanti.
- | Basanta Utsav is celebrated every year in the college.



PUBLICATIONS

In order to encourage original thought and expression among students and to keep them in touch with the various activities and events of the world, the College publishes magazine of its own every year. There is also provision for Wall Magazines prepared by the students of every department.

The college is going to publish a newsletter and a seminar proceedings in the coming academic session.

CONCESSION, STIPENDS

The philanthropic spirit of Srischandra Nandi is still retained by the college to a notable extent since a considerable number of students from very low income group are given financial assistance. Concessions to deserving student s are granted on the basis of a student s financial

constraints, merit and attendance. Students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Tribes enjoy stipends sanctioned by the Government, on submission of the prescribed form duly filled in. Assistance to the girl students for the Kanyashree Scheme, which is provided by the Govt of West Bengal, is given by the college. There is a Students' Aid & Welfare Fund to help the needy students.

STUDENTS' ENDOWMENT FUND & PRIZ

Student s' Endowment Fund has been created by the teachers, who enthusiastically contributed to raise the fund, for awarding prizes/scholarships to the students. Prizes are awarded on the basis of academic excellence in University exams, attendance, games and sports and other areas. A Prize Distribution Ceremony was held on 8th September, 2017.



STAFF WELFARE FUND

The teaching and non-teaching staff of the college have created a Staff Welfare Fund with the financial support of the college.

GUARDIANS' FORUM

Recently a Forum for the guardians has been formed. All guardians of the regular students are invited to become an active member of the forum.

This will help them to interact freely with the teachers/administration.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The college has an Alumni Association, 'Prakt ani' which organizes workshops, gettogethers and development activities. Every exstudent of the college is eligible to be its member on payment of Rs. 100 for life membership. We expect the exstudents of the college to take active part in the development of the college.



GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT OF THE COLLEGE

Systematic governance of the institution is achieved through the following methods :

SUB-COMMITTEES

RTI

In May 2005, the National Right to Information Act, 2005 was passed by the Parliament and following the act, our state government has issued 'West Bengal Right to Information Rules, 2006'. Maharaja Srischandra College has recently established its RTI Cell in line with the memorandum issued by the Government of West Bengal. Dr. Debasree De, Assistant Professor of History has been appointed for acting as the Public Information Officer (PIO) and the Principal, Dr. Shyamal Kumar Chakraborty as the Appellate Authority of the cell.

TEACHERS' COUNCIL

The Teachers' Council of the College acts as a forum for the teaching members. It is a platform where the particular problems of the teachers are addressed and solved in an amiable atmosphere. It is a body where crucial decisions between the management and the teaching members are communicated and ratified. The Council provides a space for healthy, fruitful interactions amongst the teachers. It organizes seminars, picnics and cultural programmes.

**NON-TEACHING ASSOCIATION**

There is an association of the non-teaching members, which contributes to the maintenance of office discipline and helps the Principal in the smooth running of the college.
