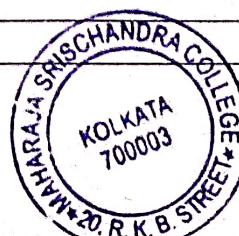

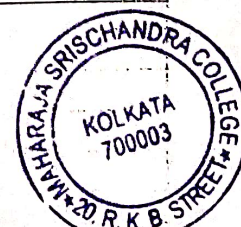

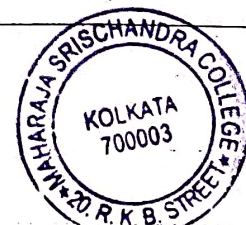

Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS)

The Maharaja Srischandra College Library offers services to all students, faculties, and non-teaching staff seeking to engage in self-directed learning. It facilitates the educational and research endeavours of the Programme provided by the college. The primary objective of the Library is to fulfil the informational requirements of all stakeholders by offering resources in various formats, adequate study environments, and effective user-centred services. The collection includes books, e-books, e-journals, print journals, CDs, DVDs, and e-resources from NLIST-INFLIBNET. The Collection of books are located in the Central Library and the Departmental Libraries. All books are processed in the Central Library. The library now possesses 35,870 books, 7 peer-reviewed journals, and 8 magazines as print resources, in addition to various electronic resources.

Library Automation: In 2007, a database of the library's contents was created using SOUL 1.0 (College Version), marking the beginning of library automation. But as operating software for this database is Windows XP version which is now obsolete, we have decided to shift our library database from SOUL to Koha. Koha is an open-source Integrated Library



System (ILS) designed for managing all library operations, including cataloguing, circulation, acquisitions, and patron management. Koha is widely used globally by libraries of all sizes due to its cost-effectiveness, community-driven development, and robust functionality. It is highly customizable and supports features like OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue), multi-branch management, and integration with various library standards (e.g., MARC21, Z39.50).

36. Environmental consciousness and sustainability/Alternate Energy / initiatives taken by the institution:

Maharaja Srischandra College follows the 3R policy (Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle) for waste minimization to fulfil the aims of “Clean and Green Campus” in terms of Zéro Waste production. The key features of waste management in Maharaja Srischandra College is as follows:

Solid Waste Management:

The colleges prioritize minimizing waste generation on campus. Solid waste is segregated at the source into biodegradable and non-biodegradable categories and handed over to the Kolkata Municipal Corporation under the Swachh Bharat initiative and the Green and Clean Kolkata program. Dustbins are strategically placed in all departments, staffrooms, and common corridors for the disposal of dry waste. Waste segregation into dry and wet categories is ensured at designated locations, contributing to a clean and eco-friendly campus environment. The use of single-use plastic items such as carry bags, cups, and laminated paper plates is strictly prohibited within the premises. Staff and students are encouraged to use cloth bags instead. Additionally, the college organizes workshops and awareness programs to promote sustainable waste practices.

Liquid Waste Management:

Wastewater from toilets and the campus canteen is treated in a soak pit and then directed through a drainage system and pipelines into the high drain for safe disposal.

E-Waste Management and Recycling:



E-waste such as computer monitors, printers, scanners, keyboards, mice, cables, cartridges, circuit boards, electric bulbs, batteries, and wires is collected and stored in a designated area. Equipment that cannot be reused or recycled is responsibly disposed of through authorized vendors.

Usage of LED Bulbs/tubes : The college uses LED bulbs/tubes in their office, principal's chambers, Library Stack room and their exclusive rooms in the shared building

11. Quick construction of second campus in order to minimize the space constraint.






