Title of the Practice	MENTOR- MENTEE PROGRAMMES
Objectives of the Practice	The college practices regular mentor-mentee programmes, both formally and informally, to focus on areas such as academic progress, career planning and counseling related to the student's identified goals towards advancement in their field of study. The objective is to guide the students in all possible way for their professional and personal growth and development.
The Context	One of the primary objectives of Maharaja Srischandra College is to look into the holistic development and wellbeing of the students who are often first-generation learners from economically backward families. As an inclusive institution we strive towards providing each and every individual equal opportunity in their academic journey. We understand that beyond imparting education, mentoring programmes create a culture of continuous learning and knowledge sharing, aiding in career advancement of the students.
The Practice	Our college strives towards building a strong bond between the teacher mentor and student mentee as they prepare our students to pursue the career of their choice. We help in connecting alumni with students/peers to network within their chosen field. The teachers regularly update the students about scholarship programmes and guide them through the process. The college has successfully helped a number of female students to avail the Kanyashree project which has immensely helped them in their higher studies.
Evidence of Success	A huge number of students are able to pursue higher education because of these practices. Even after their graduation, teachers continue to provide informal assistance and counseling to the students as they prepare for post-graduation courses and sit for competitive examinations. A number of our students have also qualified in foreign universities. Many have cracked government services and these alumni students often come and guide the juniors. Academic mentoring helps increase student persistence while also providing mentors with leadership experience.
Problems Encountered and Resources Required	Since majority of the students are coming from low-income background, they are often under pressure to earn money instead of completing higher education. Thus, counseling for not just the students but also regular interaction with their families becomes imperative. Due to financial constraints and other problems students often do not regularly participate in the mentoring programmes and it becomes difficult to keep track of their whereabouts, especially after their graduation. Collaboration with other libraries. Adequate library budget for this purpose.
