

Report of Feedback of Faculties concerning curriculum for the session 2023-24




2. How do you rate the curriculum of the programme/programmes that you teach?




3. Is the curriculum designed for a progression in depth studies within the course of graduation?




4. Are you comfortable with the time frame within which you have to deliver/complete the syllabus?




5. Are your students able to cope with the curriculum?




6. Do you have adequate resources to deliver the syllabus effectively?




7. Do your students have adequate access to reference material to do justice to the curriculum?




8. Are you satisfied with the outcome of the Programmes that you teach?




9. How would you rate the development of your students after completion of the programmes that you teach?




10. Do you think that the University Examinations test the student's comprehension and application of the subject you teach?




11. Do you think that the college is able to adapt and test the students' comprehension and application of the subject you teach?




12. Do you think the curriculum that you deliver helps inculcate human values of compassion, discipline, integrity, inclusiveness and gender sensitivity?
